Academic Program Review FAQ

What programs are required to participate in program review?

All degree programs are required to participate in the program review process or more specifically, the Campus Review and Evaluation process. This process includes a review, reflection, and possible action(s) on five evaluation criteria from the UNC Policy <u>400.1</u> and any other criteria identified by the Chancellor, President or program under review.

Degree programs without specialized accreditations are required to complete an Internal Programmatic Reflection or what was traditionally known as the Self-Study Process. The Internal Programmatic Reflection will coincide with the Campus Review and Evaluation process.

But my program has specialized accreditation, must we still participate in the program review process?

If any of the measures identified in the UNC Policy <u>400.1</u> are not required by the specialized accreditator then the college, school, or department must review, reflect, and write an action about the data provided by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Analytics.

Must non-accredited academic programs submit their Internal Programmatic Reflections to anyone other than the Provost and Office of Assessment and Accreditation?

No. The non-accredited academic program being reviewed is not required to share the results of its Internal Programmatic Reflection beyond the Provost and Office of Assessment and Accreditation.
